#### THE SCHOOL HALL


## EMPOWERING EDUCATION IN THE DIGITAL ERA:

#### **UNLEASHING POTENTIAL THROUGH BYOD**

In the dynamic landscape of the digital age, equipping students with the proficiency to harness the power of technology has become paramount. Embracing this imperative, our school embarked on a groundbreaking initiative in the academic year of 2023-24—the Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) programme—introduced in S.2 and S.4 classes. This scheme empowers students by allowing them to bring their personal iPads to school, revolutionizing the learning experience and unlocking a world of possibilities.

#### A. PERSONALIZED AND EFFICIENT LEARNING

Students can utilize their iPads to organize their learning materials and notes more effectively. Multimedia materials such as images, videos, and animation from different sources can be edited and organized easily.

BYOD also enhances the interactivity in lessons, allowing teachers to make adjustments more quickly based on student performance while students can also make reference to the materials and notes made during the lesson.

#### CHINESE



Students can use drawing as a means to express their answers, allowing the teacher to understand the level of comprehension of the lesson content among different students.

Students can engage in real-time short-answer activities, where the whole class can view and learn from each other's answers.

#### C. CULTIVATING CREATIVITY AND COLLABORATION

BYOD empowers students to unleash their creativity and collaborate seamlessly. They can use their devices to create multimedia presentations, design interactive simulations fostering a sense of ownership over their learning and promotes teamwork and problem-solving skills.

#### ICT

Tutorial videos are created by students utilizing multimedia tools on iPads. They are then shared on an online platform for review and discussion.



Students work together to review the video clips created by other classmates and make suggestions for improvement.




#### D. EXPANDING HORIZONS

BYOD also facilitates innovative learning opportunities, such as leveraging Al tools for personalized learning. Activities not possible in the past become feasible.

#### **BIOLOGY**

Students work in groups to teach an Al robot on Biology. Through identifying and correcting mistakes made by the Al robot, students can reflect on their learning progress and strategies.


## TRIUMPH IN HISTORICAL EXPLORATION

As our school approaches its 60th anniversary, it presents us with an opportune moment to reflect on our past accomplishments and eagerly anticipate the future.

Carmel Secondary School, a beacon of Christian education in Hong Kong, remains steadfast in its pursuit of excellence as a leading educational institution. We envision preparing our graduates to be future-ready leaders in various life roles. ## 迦密中學鑽禧校慶 60+ SCHOOL FOR THE FUTURE
